

I. SALUTE II Timothy 4:19

A. Salute those in authority Hebrews 13:24 Salute all them that have the rule over you, and all the saints. They of Italy salute you.

1. Respecting their position Hebrews 13:7,17 Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the word of God: whose faith follow, considering the end of their conversation... Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you.
2. Respect the person I Timothy 5:17 Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honour, especially they who labour in the word and doctrine.

B. Salute all the brethren Philippians 4:21 Salute every saint in Christ Jesus. The brethren which are with me greet you. Who do you greet when you come to church?

1. Love them in the faith Titus 3:15 All that are with me salute thee. Greet them that love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

2. Especially those you don't like Matthew 5:43-48
If you find yourself avoiding someone -
something wrong!

C. Don't draw the Sword Matthew 26:52 Then said
Jesus unto him, Put up again thy sword into his place:
for all they that take the sword shall perish with the
sword. Reason we shake with your right hand.

1. Sharp tongue Psalm 64:1-6

2. Which is more satisfying? Proverbs 12:14, 18-20

3. Come in peace I Peter 3:8-12

II. GREET II Timothy 4:21

A. Right Hand of Fellowship Galatians 2:9 And when
James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars,
perceived the grace that was given unto me, they gave
to me and Barnabas the right hands of fellowship; that
we should go unto the heathen, and they unto the
circumcision. Don't just "seem" to be pillars (*Paul
did not have the greatest relationship with them*) - be
"certain" Acts 16:1-2 Then came he to Derbe and
Lystra: and, behold, a certain disciple was there,
named Timotheus, the son of a certain woman, which
was a Jewess, and believed; but his father was a
Greek: Which was well reported of by the brethren
that were at Lystra and Iconium. There are certain
people in your life, both good and bad that are special.

B. Holy kiss II Corinthians 3:12 Greet one another with an holy kiss. **Holy** = “an awful thing”. When I think of giving _____ a kiss – Awful thing!!

1. Kiss of love I Peter 5:14 Greet ye one another with a kiss of charity.
2. Hypocrisy Luke 22:47-48 And while he yet spake, behold a multitude, and he that was called Judas, one of the twelve, went before them, and drew near unto Jesus to kiss him. But Jesus said unto him, Judas, betrayest thou the Son of man with a kiss? Romans 12:9-10 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord. All three greek words for love – Agape, Phileo, Storge.
3. We are family I John 4:7-8 Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. Some people, the only reason you kiss them is because they are family. Aunt in curlers & cold cream.

III. NAMEDROPPERS See also II Timothy 4:10-15

A. Prisca & Aquila II Timothy 4:19, Romans 10:3-5

1. Helpers Romans 16:3 Greet Priscilla and Aquila my helpers in Christ Jesus.
2. Supporters of the pastor Romans 16:4 Who have for my life laid down their own necks: unto whom not only I give thanks, but also all the churches of the Gentiles.
3. Givers Romans 16:5 Likewise greet the church that is in their house. Salute my wellbeloved Epaenetus, who is the firstfruits of Achaia unto Christ.

B. Onesiphorus II Timothy 4:19 His name means "profit-bringer," "bringing gain," or "help-bringer" II Timothy 4:16-18

1. Hospitality Romans 12:13 Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality. I Peter 4:9-10 Use hospitality one to another without grudging. As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
2. Didn't wait to be asked II Timothy 1:17-18

C. Erastus II Timothy 4:20 "beloved"

1. City Treasurer Romans 16:23 Gaius mine host, and of the whole church, saluteth you. Erastus the chamberlain of the city saluteth you, and Quartus a brother.
2. Minister to Paul Acts 19:22 So he sent into Macedonia two of them that ministered unto him,

Timotheus and Erastus; but he himself stayed in Asia for a season.

D. Trophimus II Timothy 4:20 “Nourish” Faithful to be there Acts 20:4 And there accompanied him into Asia Sopater of Berea; and of the Thessalonians, Aristarchus and Secundus; and Gaius of Derbe, and Timotheus; and of Asia, Tychicus and Trophimus. Acts 21:29 For they had seen before with him in the city Trophimus an Ephesian, whom they supposed that Paul had brought into the temple.

E. Names are important Proverbs 22:1 A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favour rather than silver and gold.

1. Eublus ("good counsel," "prudent," or "wise in counsel")
2. Prudens ("Wise," "cautious," "skilled," or "knowing")
3. Linus (flaxen-haired - blonde or "pale" derived from the Greek word for flax or linen)
4. Claudia ("lame" or "crippled")
